Indian Creek, a Towne Properties Asset Management community, held a canned food collection in October which raised over 750 pounds of food. This was taken to the Kenwood Baptist Food Pantry and the Woodspring Apartments in Kentucky to assist fire victims. Indian Creek also conducted a second food drive in late November, collecting approximately 650 pounds of food. This food was donated to the South Lebanon Food Pantry and to Hope Homes, both in Warren County.

Symmes Crossing, a JRK Residential property, raised over 125 pounds of food for LIFE in Loveland.

The AAO responded to an emergency request from the Brighton Center in Covington by donating over 400 pounds of purchased food. A purchased food delivery was also made in November to Fairfield West Baptist pantry.
